Dear Mr. Ford:

I am mailing today a sketch for  
the planting at the entrance to Haven Hill Farm.

As you will note this is a very simple  
scheme, the main idea being to draw the planting  
out to the edges, or along the fence, thus opening  
up the center and giving the entrance a better  
setting, rather than crowding the center and giving  
the outside the feeling that that does not belong  
to the entrance.

In the rear of the garage I  
have merely cut down the size of the court  
so as to give more room for roadside planting  
and in this way shut out the unsightly  
condition existing back of the garage.

I think this will preserve the  
simple farm feeling very nicely. Mr. Damgaard  
has a copy of this plan so that he will  
understand it if you care to talk it over  
with him on the ground.
